Speaker Biographies

The Hon Philip Ruddock MP Australian Attorney-General

Philip Ruddock was sworn-in as Australian Attorney-General on 7 October 2003 in a ceremony at Government House in Canberra.

Philip Ruddock was first elected to the House of Representatives as Member for Parramatta at a by-election on 22 September 1973. He was re-elected in 1974 and 1975. Following the 1977 electoral redistribution, Mr Ruddock was elected for the newly-created seat of Dundas NSW in 1977, and again in 1980, 1983, 1984, 1987 and 1990.

In 1992, Dundas was abolished as a result of changes to electoral boundaries. Mr Ruddock succeeded the retiring Member for Berowra, Dr Harry Edwards, on 13 March 1993 and was re-elected in March 1996 and appointed Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs.

Following the October 1998 election, Mr Ruddock was appointed Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs and Minister Assisting the Prime Minister for Reconciliation. In January 2001, he became Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs and Minister for Reconciliation and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs.

He was re-elected in November 2001 and on 26 November 2001 became Minister for Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs in the third Howard Ministry.

Mr Ruddock graduated from Sydney University (BA LLB). Before entering Parliament, he was partner of the boutique commercial and general law firm, Berne Murray and Trout in the city of Sydney. Philip is married to Heather and they have two daughters, Kirsty and Caitlin.



Robert Cornall Secretary Attorney-General's Department

Robert Cornall is the Secretary of the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department. Before joining the Department, Mr Cornall held key roles in public legal administration, as Managing Director of Victoria Legal Aid and as Executive Director of the Law Institute of Victoria. Mr Cornall also has extensive experience in private legal practice, having been a partner in a large Melbourne law firm for fifteen years.





Dennis Richardson AO
Director-General of Security
Australian Security Intelligence Organisation

Dennis Richardson has been Director-General of the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation (ASIO) since 1996.

Prior to that he was Deputy Secretary at the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs.

He has also worked in the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet and in the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.



Commissioner Mick Keelty APM
Australian Federal Police

Mr Keelty was appointed Commissioner of Police of the Australian Federal Police (AFP) on 2 April 2001.

Mr Keelty's policing career began in 1974 with the ACT Police, which subsequently merged with the Commonwealth Police to become the Australian Federal Police in 1979.

During his career Mr Keelty has worked in a variety of fields, including community policing, national drug operations and intelligence. He has also undertaken a lengthy secondment to the National Crime Authority to work on investigations into organised crime and corruption.

In 1995 Mr Keelty attained the rank of Assistant Commissioner (AFP Queensland). In 1998 he was appointed Assistant Commissioner (Crime).

He was appointed as Deputy Commissioner in December 2000.

Mr Keelty received the Australian Police Medal for distinguished service in 1996 and the Centenary Medal, for service to the AFP, in 2003. He was awarded the Bintang Bhayangkara Utama Medal by Her Excellency, President of the Republic of Indonesia, Madame Megawati Soekarnoputri, in 2003 in recognition of the AFP's close cooperation with the Indonesian National Police. He holds a Master of Public Policy and Administration, a Graduate Certificate in Criminal Justice Education, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and is a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Management.

As Commissioner of the AFP, Mr Keelty is the Chair of the Board of the Australian Crime Commission. Mr Keelty is also the Deputy Chair of the Australian National Council on Drugs and Co-Chair of the Board of Control of the Australian Institute of Police Management.

The Commissioner is a Member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and is also an Advisory Fellow of the Australian National University Regulatory Institutions Network (RegNet).

Andrew Metcalfe
Deputy Secretary
Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet

Andrew Metcalfe is currently Deputy Secretary in the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet responsible for coordination of policy advice to the Prime Minister on counter-terrorism, security, border protection, law enforcement, defence, intelligence, foreign affairs and machinery of government issues. He is a Member of the Council of the Order of Australia and of the Administrative Review Council, and a Director of the National Australia Day Council. He commenced in his current position in August 2002.

Mr Metcalfe is the chair of the National Counter-Terrorism Committee, which comprises key Australian Government law enforcement, security and defence agencies, as well as senior State and Territory officials and Deputy Police Commissioners. The Committee reports to the Prime Minister, and State and Territory Heads of Government, on national counter-terrorism policy issues and operational preparedness. He also chairs the Australian Government Counter-Terrorism Policy Committee, which coordinates the policy activities of all relevant Australian Government departments and agencies.

Immediately prior to his present appointment, Mr Metcalfe was Deputy Secretary of the Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs for a period of three years. David Templeman is Director-General of Emergency Management Australia (EMA), a Division of the Attorney-General's Department, responsible for reducing the impact of natural, technological and human-caused disasters on the Australian community.

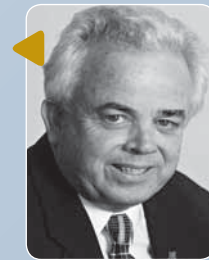
Since his appointment as Director General in June 2000, David has managed EMA in the promotion of a national approach to emergency management in all jurisdictions throughout Australia, and in the Asia/Pacific Region. His whole-of-government, multi-agency approach has been embraced by emergency management organisations, the volunteer sector, community groups, and the media.

Over the past four years, David's particular challenges have included dealing with the re-entry of the Mir Space Station in early 2001, contributing to enhanced national security arrangements in Australia since the September 11 terrorist attacks in 2001 and the Bali bombings in 2002, and liaising on national health issues such as the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome epidemic in 2003. He also led the coordination of Australian Government assistance in response to major bushfires in eastern Australia in 2002-03, and following tropical cyclones that impacted on Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, Niue, Vanuatu, and the Solomon Islands. The latest challenge was managing EMA's role in Operation Tsunami Assist following the earthquake off Sumatra on 26 December 2004.

David's leadership has enabled EMA to enhance emergency and consequence management arrangements within the Australian, State and Territory Government environments, and to create "safer sustainable communities". His stewardship has also been recognised at national and international conferences in addresses focussing on the Australian Government's preparedness to meet and to deal with the consequences of disasters, including acts of terrorism, in an "all hazards" context.

David's public service career spans 36 years in the fields of Human Resource Management, Organisational Management, major Departmental restructuring, and now emergency and consequence management. Nearly half of his public service has been in Senior Executive Service positions.

David was born in Hobart, Tasmania, and is a graduate of the Australian National University, the Australian Defence Staff College, and the Harvard Business School.

He is also a member of the Australian Government Counter-Terrorism Policy Committee. Ed is chair of the Australian Government Counter-Terrorism Committee responsible for the coordination of the whole-of-government activity dealing with counter-terrorism and other protective security issues. He also chairs the Special Incident Task Force that coordinates the Australian Government/State/Territory whole of government response to an incident involving politically motivated violence, including counter-terrorism.

Ed is chair of the Protective Security Policy Committee responsible for the coordination of the development and implementation of Australian Government Protective Security Policy, promulgated through the Protective Security Manual (PSM). He was awarded the PSM for outstanding public service in the development and coordination of policies and arrangements for safeguarding national security and the Australian Government's protective security interests in the Australia Day Honours List 2004. Prior to his appointment Ed was a member of the AFP and was awarded the Australian Police Medal (APM) in 1997 for distinguished service.

Deputy Assistant Commissioner Peter Clarke CVO QPM LL.B
Head, Anti-Terrorist Branch
New Scotland Yard

Peter Clarke was born in 1955 and joined the Metropolitan Police in 1977 after graduating in Law from Bristol University. In the early part of his career he worked at a number of locations in London in both uniform and detective roles, including periods on murder enquiries and in international drugs intelligence.

There followed postings in strategic planning, as operations head in a central London division, and as Staff Officer to the Commissioner. In 1994 he became the Commander of Brixton Division in South London and was in post during an outbreak of serious public disorder. In 1997 he assumed command of the Royalty and Diplomatic Protection Department, with responsibility for the protection and security of the Royal Family and their residences, the diplomatic community in London and the Houses of Parliament. In June 2000 he became the Deputy Director of Personnel for the Metropolitan Police, and in June 2002 was appointed as Head of the Anti-Terrorist Branch at New Scotland Yard and National Co-ordinator for Terrorist Investigations.

He attended the Royal College of Defence Studies in 2002, was made a Commander of the Royal Victorian Order in 2001 and was awarded the Queen's Police Medal in 2003.



Air Marshal Angus Houston AO, AFC
Chief of Air Force
Royal Australian Air Force

Air Marshal Houston joined the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) as a cadet pilot in 1970 and spent the early part of his career flying Iroquois helicopters in various parts of Australia, Papua New Guinea and Indonesia. After graduation from the Flying Instructors Course in 1975, Air Marshal Houston completed several instructional tours on Macchi, BAC Strikemaster and Iroquois aircraft. A posting to the Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) from 1976-1978 was followed, by two years at No 9 Squadron at RAAF Base Amberley. In late 1979 Air Marshal Houston was posted to Hill Air Force Base, Utah USA for exchange flying duties with a United States Air Force helicopter unit. Air Marshal Houston was admitted as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in 1990 for his work in the transfer of responsibility for Blackhawk operations.



Following graduation from Joint Services Staff College, Air Marshal Houston was posted to the Joint Operations staff at Headquarters Australian Defence Force and was involved in strategic planning during the Gulf crisis of 1990/91. 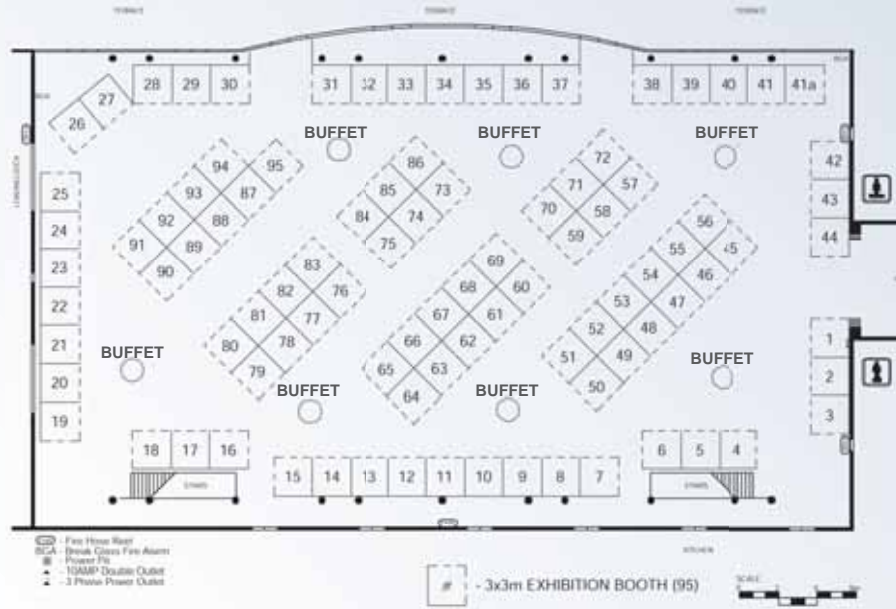

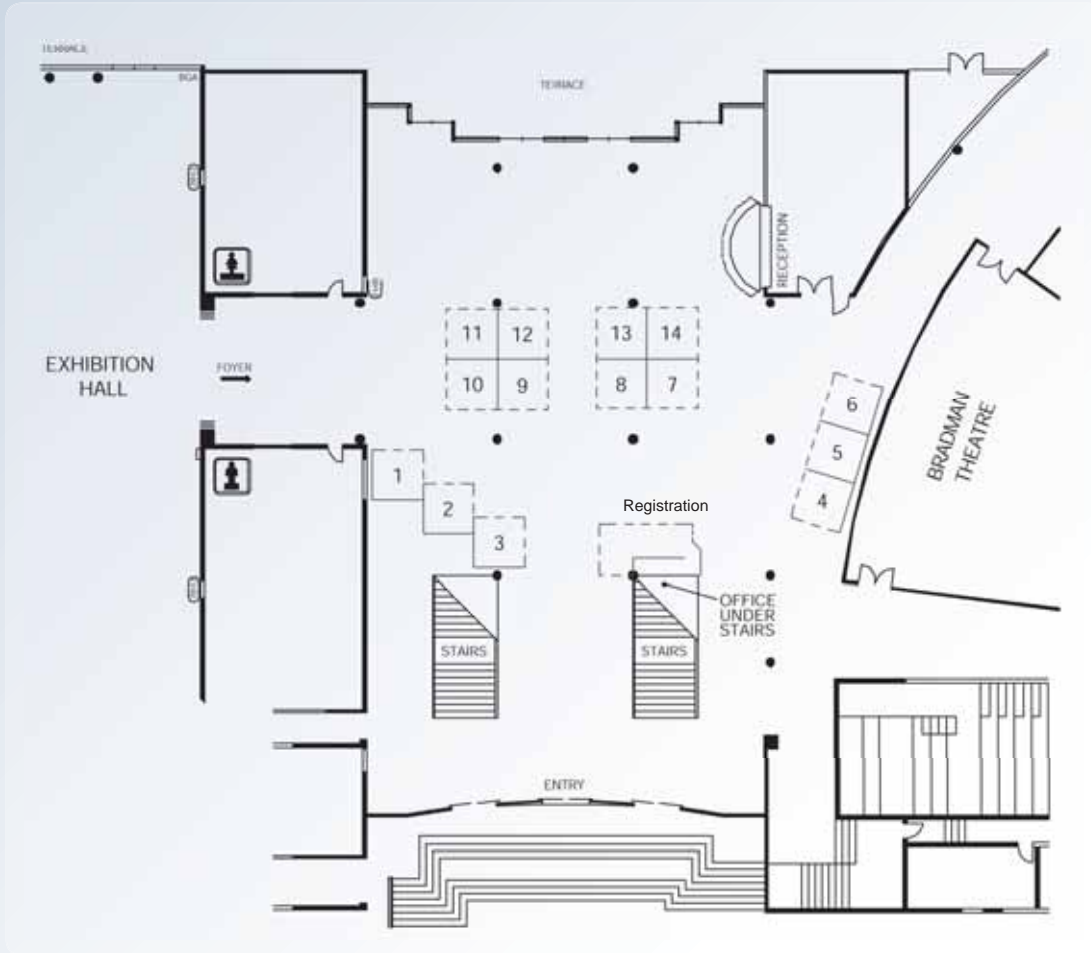
