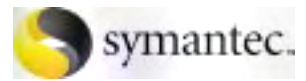

## Mr Robert Cornall AO

**Secretary

Robert Cornall AO has extensive experience at a high level in public administration.

He is the Secretary of the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department and has been in that position since 2000.

Prior to his appointment as Secretary, he was Managing Director of Victoria Legal Aid from 1995 to 2000 and Executive Director and Secretary of the Law Institute of Victoria from 1987 to 1995. ## Air Chief Marshal Angus Houston AO AFC

**Chief of the Defence Force**

Air Chief Marshal Allan Grant (Angus) Houston joined the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) as a cadet pilot in 1970. He spent the early part of his career flying Iroquois helicopters in various parts of Australia, Papua New Guinea and Indonesia.

He is a qualified Flight Instructor and completed several instructional tours on Macchi, BAC Strikemaster and Iroquois aircraft in the late 1970's. He also served on exchange with the Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) and in late 1979 was posted to Hill Air Force Base, Utah for exchange duties with a United States Air Force helicopter unit.

Air Chief Marshal Houston's principal command appointments include Number 9 Squadron in 1987, during the introduction of the Blackhawk, the relocation of the unit from Amberley to Townsville and its transfer to Army, 5<sup>th</sup> Aviation Regiment in 1989 and Number 86 Wing from 1994-1995. He was also Commander Integrated Air Defence System from 1999-2000.

Air Chief Marshal Houston has wide staff experience having served on the Joint Operations staff at Headquarters Australian Defence during the Gulf crisis of 1990-1991. He was the Director Air Force Policy during 1992-1993 where he negotiated the establishment of the RSAF Flying School at RAAF Base Pearce. He also served at Headquarters Australian Theatre from 1997-1999 as Chief of Staff, and Head Strategic Command from 2000-2001.



He was promoted to Air Chief Marshal and assumed his current appointment as Chief of the Defence Force on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2005 after four years as Chief of Air Force.

He is a graduate of the Flying Instructors Course (1975), RAAF Staff College (1985), Joint Services Staff College (1990) and the Royal College of Defence Studies in London (1996).

In 2003, Air Chief Marshal Houston was advanced as an Officer in the Order of Australia, having previously been appointed a Member in 1990. In 1980 he was awarded the Air Force Cross.

Angus Houston and his wife Liz, who is a teacher, have three sons.

Air Chief Marshal Houston is the third RAAF officer to be appointed to the most senior position in the Australian Defence Force. Air Chief Marshal Sir Frederick Scherger, KBE, CB, DSO, AFC was Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee from May 1961 to May 1966, and Air Chief Marshal Sir Neville McNamara, KBE, AO, AFC, AE was Chief of Defence Force Staff from April 1982 to April 1984.



## Mr Paul O'Sullivan

**Director-General of Security  
Australian Security Intelligence Organisation**

Prior to taking up his current position as Director-General of Security at the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation (ASIO) in July 2005, Paul O'Sullivan was Senior Adviser (International) to the Prime Minister from January 2004. Previously he served as Deputy Secretary at the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (2003-2004), Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany, to Switzerland and to Liechtenstein (1999-2003) and Minister and Deputy Chief of Mission at Australia's largest overseas mission in Washington. (1996-1998).

From 1994 to 1996, Mr O'Sullivan headed two divisions of the Australian Department of Foreign and Trade dealing successively with Australia's political and economic relations with Europe and the Americas; and with international organisations and legal issues.

From 1991 to 1994, Mr O'Sullivan was Australia's Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations for Disarmament issues, based in Geneva, Switzerland. Prior to this, Mr O'Sullivan served in Australian Embassies in Rome, Washington and Cairo. He has held a variety of senior positions in the Australian Government.

Mr O'Sullivan was born in Sydney in 1948 and is a graduate of the University of Sydney. He and his wife Merrilyn have three sons.

## Mr Peter Varghese

**Director-General  
Office of National Assessments**

Mr Peter Varghese was appointed as the Director-General of the Office of National Assessments (ONA) on 12 January 2004. ONA reports directly to the Prime Minister and is responsible for advising the Government on international political, strategic and economic developments affecting Australia's national interests. ONA is also responsible for the coordination of Australia's foreign intelligence activities and maintains close consultation with the intelligence agencies of other countries.

Prior to his appointment to ONA Mr Varghese was the Senior Adviser (International) to the Prime Minister.

For most of his professional life Mr Varghese has been a career officer of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade which he joined in 1979. He has served in Vienna (1980-83), Washington (1985-88), as Minister (Political) in Tokyo in 1994 and as High Commissioner to Malaysia (2000-02).

From December 2002 to July 2003 Mr Varghese was Deputy Secretary of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. His other assignments in that department have included: Director of the Speech Writing Unit (1988-90), Assistant Secretary, Personnel (1991-92), First Assistant Secretary, Public Affairs Division (1994 to 1996) and Head of the White Paper Secretariat (1996-97) responsible for drafting Australia's first White Paper on Foreign Affairs and Trade policy. Mr Varghese served as First Assistant Secretary of the International Security Division in 1997 before being seconded, in February 1998, to the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet as Head of the International Division.

Mr Varghese was born in Kenya in 1956 and migrated to Australia as a young child. He is a graduate in history from the University of Queensland and is married with one adult son.



## Mr Andrew Metcalfe

Andrew Metcalfe is the Secretary of the Department of Immigration and Citizenship. He was appointed in July 2005. 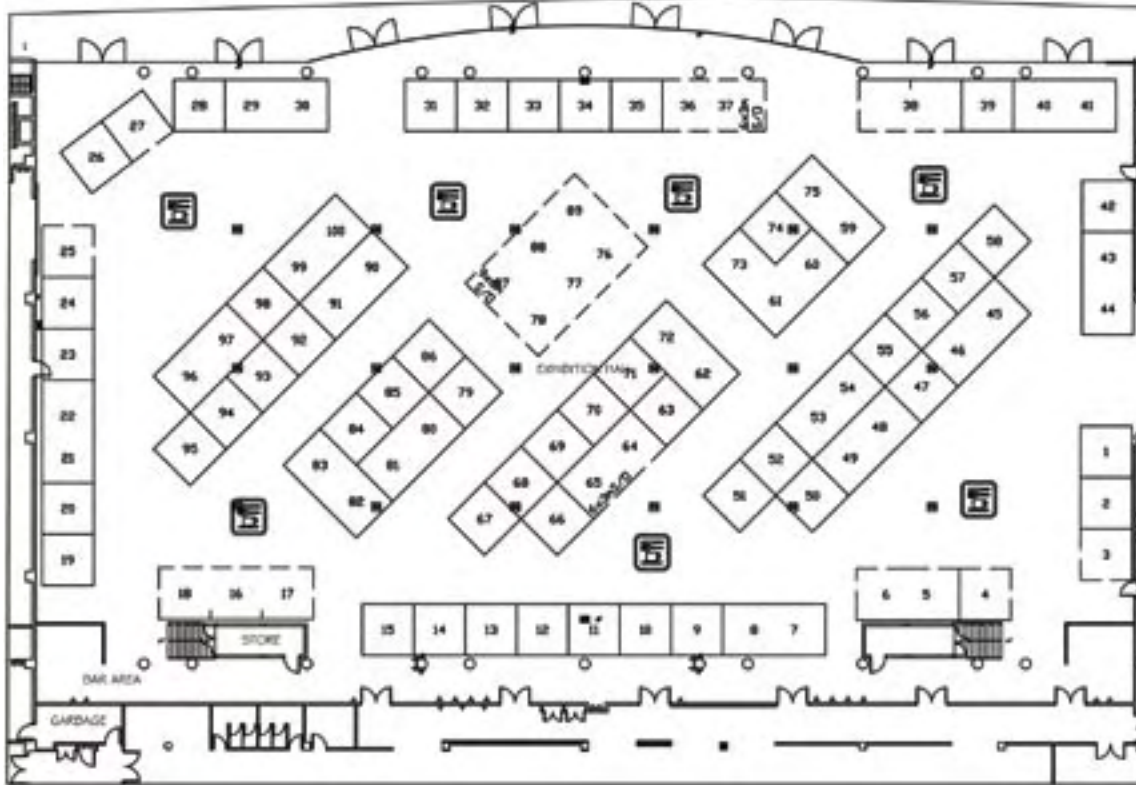

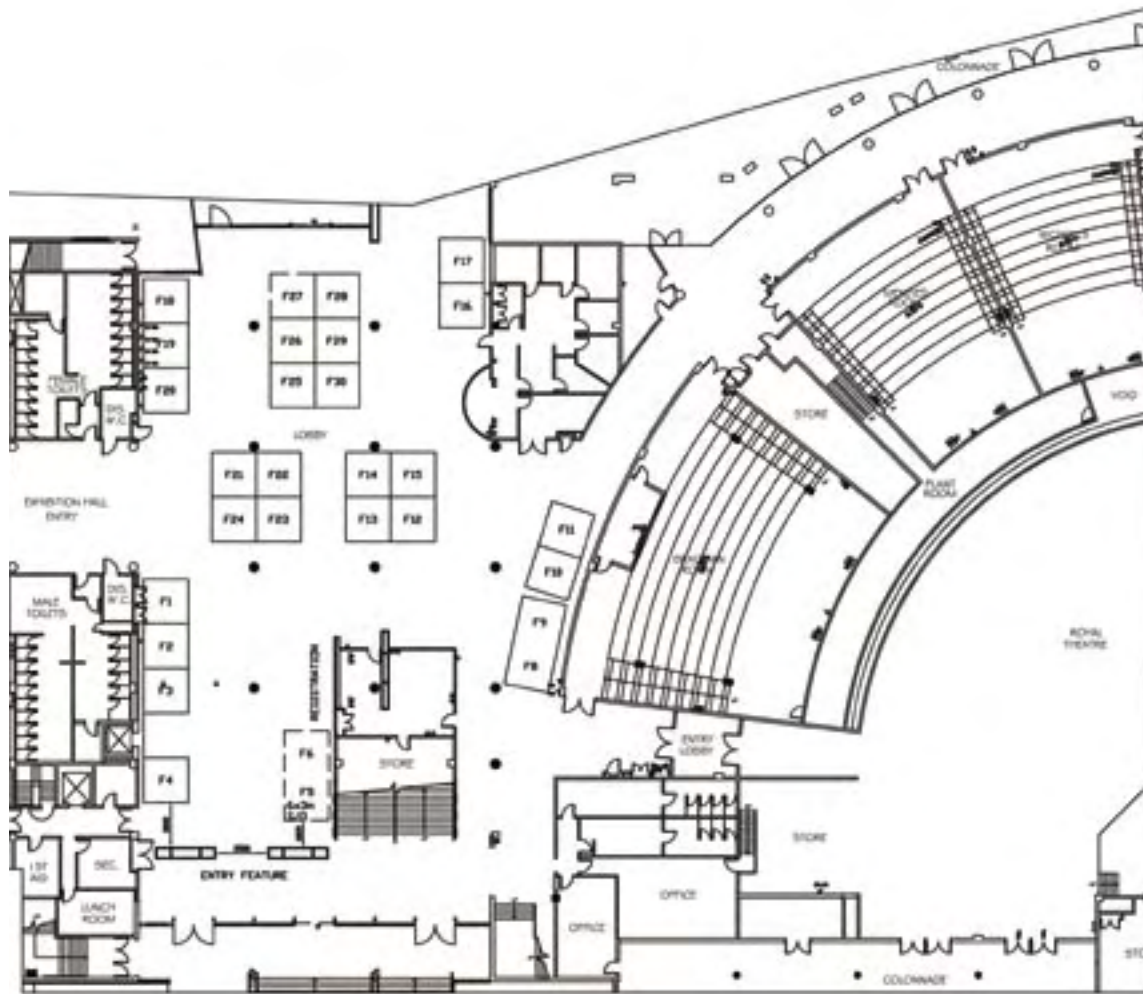
